

"How Will You Get to Bethlehem?"

It was 1865 in Philadelphia. The Civil War had just ended. President Lincoln had been assassinated. Serving the church through the tumultuous years of the war had taken a terrible toll on a 30-year-old Episcopal priest. Members of his church had lost husbands, fathers and sons in battle. Others had returned from war with physical and emotional scars.

Exhausted, the priest was granted a sabbatical by his congregation. He spent fall of 1865 traveling through Europe, eventually arriving in the Holy Land. Day after day, his soul was refreshed as he visited the places where Jesus had spent his earthly ministry.

Then, on Christmas Eve, he had an experience that would change his life forever. He rode from Jerusalem to Bethlehem on horseback, a six-mile journey. At dusk, he approached the town where, long before, Jesus was born. Looking out over the City of David, he imagined what it was like for those whose faces shone around the manger on the night of our Savior's birth. Soaking in the whole scene, the young priest penned a poem in his journal.

The priest's name was Phillips Brooks, and a few years later his poem was put to music.

O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie;

Above thy deep and dreamless sleep, the silent stars go by.

Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light;

The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.

A journey to Bethlehem on horseback changed Phillips Brooks' life. In the presence of Christ, he had a spiritual awakening. He returned to Philadelphia with new enthusiasm for ministry.

As you celebrate Christmas this year, I want to ask you: How will you get to Bethlehem? As I write this, the people in the region where Bethlehem is located are on our hearts and minds. A special prayer for peace is included in this newsletter. Please join in prayer that the light of Christ will shine in the darkness of war.

Advent is filled with opportunities to get to Bethlehem. Getting to Bethlehem is finding space and time for prayer and devotional reading. Getting to Bethlehem is attending worship, glorifying God with hymns and songs, hearing the Good News of great joy proclaimed, and offering our prayers and ourselves. Getting to Bethlehem is serving and giving. It's sharing the love of Christ with each other and with our neighbors.

I pray that, like Phillips Brooks long ago, you will get to Bethlehem this Christmas. May you experience the wondrous gift given to us in the Holy Child of Bethlehem. He still brings hope, peace, joy, and love to all who humbly seek him.

Wednesday Bible Study | Starts Jan. 10, 6:45 p.m.



No, I can't not tell you about all the great books we receive every month. And, I have the perfect books to get you into the Christmas spirit and fit with your busy schedule.



We Three Kings is a three-novella collection of romances written by three women. Each story is centered on a different generation of the Weise family. Crystal Caudill starts the book with "Star of Wonder". The setting is a historical look at the Weise family's grand steamer ship that was supposed to launch a new Weise business – and maybe even a dynasty. But plans go awry, and Aldrich Weise's life takes a turn he hadn't expected.

Cara Putman's "Beauty Bright" finds the next generation of Weise men in the midst of World War II. Lt. Charles Weise serves as part of the Monuments Man group working to restore Europe's stolen art to its rightful owners.

Last but not least is "Perfect Light" written by Angela Ruth Strong. Needless to say, there are a few twists and turns to this Weise man's life.

December Prayer Focus: Peace for the People in Israel and Gaza

The deadly attack on Israel by the militant group, Hamas, was devastating news. In addition to the hostages taken, the escalating violence has killed or injured thousands. The humanitarian crisis in this region is extremely dire due to continued fighting. As the Church, we are called to pray for peace. Here is one prayer that you can use, adapted from one written by World Relief, a charitable organization that has been addressing urgent needs in war-torn areas around the world since the 1940s:

Lord, we lift our eyes to you — the Maker of heaven and earth.

We ask for a miracle – let your love invade the hearts of all people in Israel and Gaza in order to bring peace in their land.

We lift our prayer to you, Lord, hear us.

Let violence cease in the region. Let there be no more bloodshed. We know your heart breaks for those killed and those left behind — for the orphaned child, the injured elderly, those abducted and families desperate for safety. Lord, speak into this crisis.

We lift our prayer to you, Lord, hear us.

We pray for those who have lost loved ones. Let your presence surround them like a warm embrace. Please protect and provide for those who have been abducted and bring them home safely. Let them be reunited with their loved ones and feel your comfort.

We lift our prayer to you, Lord, hear us.

We pray that you open doors that allow food, essentials and medical supplies to reach those in need. May first responders be able to rescue the injured, console the grieving and help rebuild many lives.

We lift our prayer to you, Lord, hear us.

Income for the five-Sunday month of October was \$78,473, about \$8,000 less than our average 5-week budget expectation. Spending for the month was \$76,990, leaving us roughly \$1,500 positive for the month. We continue to run ahead of our year-to-date giving budget, and year-to-date expenses continue to be in line for the first ten months of the year. Thank you for giving your prayers, talents and gifts in support of First Church's work to spread the good news of Jesus Christ. And, thank you to staff and volunteers who continue to act as good stewards of all these gifts.
