"First God Loves, Then God Gives"

On Nov. 12, we'll celebrate Consecration Sunday at First Church. During worship services that day, you'll be invited to make a financial commitment to "Open Doors with Christ, One Another and Our Neighbors" in 2024. As you consider what your gift will be, I want to ask, "What inspires you to give?" When I think of what inspires me to give, a beloved verse from John's Gospel comes to mind:

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him won't perish but will have eternal life. (John 3:16)

This verse tells us three things about God's giving through Jesus:

- 1. God's motivation was love. (God so loved the world...)
- 2. God gave sacrificially. (... that he gave his only Son...)
- 3. God gave in response to our need. (... so that everyone who believes in him won't perish...)

God loved us. Then, out of this great love, God gave! In the same way, our giving flows out of our love for God and for others.

First, we give in order to express gratitude. Giving is one of our most important ways to say "thanks" for God's love toward us. A friend once called the annual stewardship Sunday in his congregation "Glad Response Sunday." I like that because that's what our giving is: a joyful response to God's love for us! Christ-centered giving is motivated by love.

Second, we give in order to grow. By now, you may be familiar with the step-up chart we provide as a tool for your growth through giving. Each year, you're invited to ask, "What's my next faithful step?" That step may involve sacrifice, as we allow God to reorder our priorities to kingdom priorities. The record is clear. Generous givers are typically happier and more spiritually vigorous than those who are not generous. Christ-centered giving is sacrificial.

Third, we give in order to be involved. On Consecration Sunday, we also want to honor the way that your tithes, time and talents edify our church and enhance our community through a variety of ministries and missions. We celebrate all ways we as a church are involved in God's good work and encourage everyone to take part.

We give because something in the church has caught our eye or warmed our heart or stirred our mind. We give because of the love we have experienced in our church family. We give because a small group or class which has nurtured our spiritual life. We give because the worship or the sermon has touched our hearts. We give because together we make a difference in the lives of our neighbors near and far away. We give to bring light into darkness.

As you consider your financial commitment to God's ministry at First Church for 2024, remember God's gift to you in Jesus Christ. God gave lovingly, sacrificially, and in response to our need. God calls us to give in the same way. God is able, through our giving, to do abundantly far more than we can ask or imagine!

From the Library

I've always loved November. I love that hint of winter coming, and with it Thanksgiving, fire pits, fall decorations and just the change of seasons. Our nation honors our veterans in November, which is another chance to be aware of how blessed we are to live in the land of the free provided by those who sacrificed to give us liberty. On top of all those great blessings are also the little blessings in our church library. We have the best books, and I'm so lucky to get to share some of them with you. Here are a couple of new books I know you'll be eager to read.



Many of us have experienced Beth Moore's exceptional Bible studies, and she is regarded as a leading Bible scholar and a champion for women. Over the years, she has led us deeply into the Bible with insight and knowledge. She has also been a champion of her Southern Baptist faith and shocked everyone when she left the church in 2018. While watching her Bible study videos, I always thought, Here is a woman who has it all together, and she must have a perfect life. But now Moore tells us of her struggles in her memoir, All My Knotted-Up Life. As a child, she endured abuse from her father and had a front-row seat to her mother's mental health struggles. Yet, she felt God's presence, was baptized at the age of nine and began her journey with God as her guide. She discusses her start in the church, founding Living Proof Ministries, and her journey in and away from the Southern Baptist Church. She also writes of her personal life, which has had its ups and downs. Still, she has kept her faith. She writes candidly and with wit. You won't want to miss her life's story (and you might want to keep the tissues handy). Beth Moore is a hard act to follow, but Wanda Brunstetter has always been a favorite in the library. Her latest book, Sisters by the Sea, is very interesting to me. She is joined by her daughter-in-law Jean, her granddaughter Richelle, and Jean's daughter-in-law Lorraine to write a novella of four stories set in Sarasota, Florida. Not only are the settings all the same, but each writer has also written a story about one of the Lambright sisters. These four sisters are originally from Indiana, but decided to move to Florida for reasons of their own. I won't let the cat out of the bag as to whether the sisters find what they are looking for or if they return home. I also wanted to highlight this book as I find it so special that four Brunstetters have bonded by writing a book together. To have a granddaughter continue her legacy as a storyteller must be gratifying beyond belief, and adding two more family members to that legacy would be hard to imagine.

As always, if these aren't the books that you're looking for, stop in the library, and one of our volunteers will help you find just the right book or jigsaw puzzle.

Financial Report

2023 Budget \$900,886

Expected Income – YTD \$675,664 (75% of budget) Actual Income – YTD \$683,825 (76% of budget) Actual Expenses – YTD \$677,993 (75% of budget)

Income for the four-Sunday month of September was \$73,884, about \$4,000 more than our average fourweek budget expectation. This is likely because the fall months have our congregation and guests returning from summer vacations. As a result, we continue to run ahead of our year-to-date giving budget. In September, expenses were generally in line with budget, and our year-to-date income has outpaced year-to-date expenses through the first nine months of the year. Thank you for giving your prayers, talents and gifts in support of First Church's work to spread the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ. And, thank you to staff and volunteers who continue to act as good stewards of all these gifts.

Please continue to show your support for the mission of First Church by participating in our 2024 stewardship campaign, Consecration Sunday, coming up on Nov. 12. Also, we continue to ask for your consideration of making a gift to reduce our Bell Tower loan debt as guickly as possible. We have already reduced the debt from this \$260,000 project to less than \$80,000. You can make a donation on the Church Center app or with a check. Please contact the church office for information. Sleep Out for the Homeless | Nov. 17-18

Did you know that our annual Sleep Out for the Homeless has been happening for 30 years? In 2023, First Church will host this event to raise money and awareness for the homeless for the 31st time. Once again on the Friday evening before Thanksgiving, students will line Simpson Street to collect spare change from passing traffic. When not on the streets, students are taking a break in the soup kitchen, praying, or participating in a hands-on learning activity about the realities of homelessness. Students also construct cardboard shelters and face the elements as they sleep outside through the night. In recent years Mechanicsburg Brethren in Christ's youth group has join First Church's youth group in making this event possible.

The event has shifted and adapted through the years, but it continues to be an important way for the local agencies that benefit from the funds raised. Each year, we have raised upwards of \$5,000 to donate to local organizations dedicated to helping the homeless in our area. This year's recipients will be One80Ministries, Family Promise and New Hope Ministries. These organizations do so much to help those affected by homelessness in our community, and it's a joy to support their continual efforts of caring for those in need.

How can you be involved?

- *Pray for our event*. Pray that students would learn more about the realities of homelessness, for our students' safety, and for the generosity of those passing by Friday evening.
- Volunteer at the Sleep Out. If you're an adult with current clearances, you can help keep our students safe by assisting in the soup kitchen or being one of the supervising adults along the streets, at our entrance, or at the warming burn barrels.
