"Remember"


I'm looking forward to sharing the 40-day journey of Lent with you this year, beginning Feb. 14. We're planning a sermon series and a church-wide study based on a new book by Susan Robb entitled, "Remember: God's Covenants and the Cross". In our weekly worship services and small groups, we'll explore the covenants God made with all of us through Noah, Abraham, Moses, David and Jesus.

Rev. Robb invites us to study God's covenants because, as we do, "we will soon discover... that when God remembers God's people, deliverance and salvation begin. And when God remembers us, we are then asked to remember what God has done for us, especially in this season of Lent." (p. x)

God remembers us. Those three simple words grabbed my attention as I read this book. Noah, Abraham, Moses and David certainly had their flaws. The Bible is quite transparent about their sins and the heartbreak that resulted. We might think that God would just move on and forget them. Yet, God remembered them. God saw promise in them that perhaps they could not even see in themselves. God chose each of them to play a special role in God's redemption story.

Like our ancestors in the faith, we have our flaws, but God has not forgotten us. God sees promise in us and calls us to join in the unfolding of God's redemption story in Christ. This Lenten Season, I invite you to receive this good news: God remembers us! I also invite you to be aware that God is with you. How are you experiencing God's presence with you? What is God calling you to do in response?




Zoe Mazi | Mondays, 7:15-8:45 p.m.




Health and Wellness Presentation | Sunday, Feb. 4, 9:45-10:45 a.m.

From the Library

As I sit here in my warm cozy house on this first snowy day in nearly three years, my mind goes to France in the winter of 1940-41. The French were experiencing a German occupation, along with their coldest winter on record. The Germans gave the French almost no coal or heating oil. Parisians burned furniture and secretly cut down trees in public parks to stay warm. They were a hardy lot.



Why am I thinking of this almost 80 years later? Because the library has a new book, *The Paris Housekee-per*, by Renee Ryan. Ryan is known for writing historical fiction set in France during World War II. In this book, she takes us to the Ritz Hotel, which was known as a place Germans lived in luxury as the average Parisian struggled to keep warm and find enough food for each day. The three women who take center stage in this book are all very different. Camille, a maid at the Ritz, despises the Germans, but she must work to support her widowed mother and sisters. Vivian Miller is a fabulously rich American pretending to be a Nazi sympathizer, but she uses her wealth to help Jews obtain travel papers. Lastly is Rachel, also a chambermaid, but Jewish and in danger. If you like this genre, you'll find the twists and turns of this story make it hard to put down. I won't ruin the plot with more facts – I'll leave that to you!

This morning, I'm also feeling the need for a little more adrenaline. And, who better to provide that than Lynette Eason and her latest book, *Double Take*. This is also the first book in the "Lake City Heroes" series. Physician assistant Lainie Jackson lived through her ex-boyfriend's attempt to kill her. In fact, she was able to grab a weapon and kill him – or so she thought. 18 months later, he's back to finish what he started. Lainie turns to police detective James Holton for help. James worked in the Army Criminal Investigation Division, but left to work for the police after sustaining wounds when an IED blew up near him. Lainie and James join forces to find out if her former boyfriend or someone else is trying to kill her.

There's not a minute to waste in this life-or-death scenario. Yes, another page turner. The only bad news here is the next installment of this series isn't due until August. But, that gives you plenty of time to check out something on the shelf that you may have overlooked earlier.

Hope to see you in the library. With winter seemingly in full swing now, don't be shy about taking an extra book or two in case church is canceled. And, I think winter is the perfect time to borrow a jigsaw puzzle.

February Hospitality Tip: Welcoming Resources

Part of creating a welcoming environment for all is ensuring that our guests know about all of the resources available to them on a Sunday morning while worshipping. So that you know and can extend warm hospitality in our building, here's a list of items for everyone's convenience and safety:

FOR YOUR COMFORT

Seat Cushions

For the pews, located in the basket just inside the entrance to the sanctuary by the choir loft.

Hearing Assistance Devices

Located at the sound booth.

Shawls

Located just outside the sanctuary at the entrance by the choir loft and at the entrance by the library.

Comfort Corner

This quiet room off the sanctuary balcony by the staircase is available for any parent who desires to have some privacy with their child, while still being present in worship.

Fidget Toys

Located in the center corner of the sanctuary balcony, along with other items intended to help a person in need to reduce sensory overload.

FIRST AID KITS

Our Health and Wellness Team maintains several first aid kits all around First Church:

1. Office

The office staff maintains a small kit, which is the best to access for outdoor events.

2. Sanctuary

Located behind sound desk; contains glucose tablets.

3. Multipurpose Room

Located in the closet; contains glucose tablets, and antibiotic ointment.

4. Lobby

Stored in plastic tub on far left of the wooden cabinet along multipurpose room wall; contains glucose tablets, aspirin, Tylenol, Benadryl, antibiotic ointment.

5. Kitchen

Hangs on the wall by the toaster; contains glucose tablets, Benadryl, Tylenol, aspirin, antibiotic

ointment.

6, Second Floor

Located in the alcove outside of the central stairwell, mounted on the wall above the couch.

LIFEVACS

Four LifeVacs are available in the event of a choking incident:

1. Children's Wing, First Floor

Located in the stairwell by the playground.

2. Children's Wing, Second Floor

Located in teacher resource room (last room on left).

3. Kitchen

Located near first aid kit.

4. Youth Lounge

Watch a training video to learn how LifeVac works at lifevac.net/training.

AED

The AED is located in the main lobby on the wall to the left of the gym doors.

WHEELCHAIRS

Several wheelchairs are located in various locations around First Church.

1. Main Entrance Hallway

Located on left at end away from main entrance doors.

2. Sanctuary, Pew Side

Located in back left alcove at Frederick Street entrance.

3. Sanctuary, Green Chair Side

Located behind green chairs, under the balcony.

4, Fellowship Hall

Located at the bottom of alley entrance steps.

5. Second Floor

Located in classroom 223 at the end of children's hallway (across from "Heaven Room")

SPILL KIT

A spill kit is located in the kitchen on the cupboard by the first aid kit.

Income for the five-Sunday month of December was \$100,254, about \$13,000 more than our average five-week budget expectation. Spending for the month was \$79,710, leaving us roughly \$20,500

positive for the month.

We finished the year with an operating surplus, which allowed us to appropriate additional funds to key areas of our ministry. We put 10% of this surplus into missions. We also applied nearly \$9,500 of the surplus to our bell tower restoration loan debt and another \$9,500 toward future Trustee projects. A complete 2023 financial report is included in this newsletter.

Thanks to your generosity and support of our mission, the loan balances are roughly \$43,000 due on the parsonage and \$77,000 due on the Bell Tower.


