From the Pastor's Desk....

### "Jesus Calls Us to the Center"

Near the end of his life, Rembrandt captured one of the most beautiful scenes in the Bible in his painting, "The Return of the Prodigal Son." At the center of the painting, the son kneels humbly at his father's feet. His clothes are tattered, and his body is thin and frail. Weeping, he buries his head in the father's robe. The father looks weary, but his face is full of compassion. He stands over his son with his hands tenderly placed on the young man's shoulders.

The father and son are the focal point of the painting, but they're not the only characters. There are four others in Rembrandt's masterpiece: two women and two men. One woman stands at a distance, in a dark corner. She is indifferent to the beautiful reunion. Another woman leans against a wall, a look of curiosity on her face. A third character, a man, is seated. While this powerful scene at the center of the painting takes place, he stares into space as if daydreaming. The other man, thought to be the older brother, stands upright, seeming quite upset as he watches the father so lovingly embrace the prodigal.

I first saw a print of this painting 30 years ago, after hearing the late spiritual writer, Father Henri Nouwen, lecture at Johns Hopkins Medical Center. Since then, I've had a small copy of it in my study. Looking at it reminds me of when Nouwen invited us to consider where we see ourselves in the painting. He asked, "Do you see yourself at the center of the painting, the repentant sinner receiving the warm embrace of the merciful Father? Or, are you one of the bystanders, looking on from a distance, but not entering into a relationship with the Father?"

Nouwen helped me to see that it's possible to be quite religious without really knowing God. One can attend worship, participate in a Sunday School class or a small group Bible study, serve on a church committee, do all sorts of good deeds, and still remain detached from a personal relationship with the heavenly Father. Christianity is not about the practice of outward forms. It is about a dynamic relationship with God that transforms our lives.

Rembrandt's painting calls us to the center. At the center is that place where we confess, as the prodigal did, that we have sinned and repent. At the center is also grace and forgiveness. We are welcomed into the Father's loving arms. We come to know, in a deeply personal way, peace and joy, which none of our wanderings could ever provide.

As we continue our Lenten journey this March, I encourage you to step into the center. Kneel before your heavenly Father. Confess your needs. Let His loving arms embrace you, as you remember Jesus' sufferings, death, and resurrection!

### From the Library

I'm writing this article on a dreary day, and I think there have been way too many of these gray days lately. While the earth needs rain, I feel like I need a little sunshine. But, I'll take my mind off the gloom by telling you about some great books in our library. A little later when I am reading, I'm sure I won't notice the gloom at all. See if that works for you.

Last year, the library introduced a new author, Sharon Mondragon, who wrote *The Unlikely Yarn of the Dragon Lady*. If you missed this heartwarming



tale, you might want to read that first. The book features a ladies' knitting circle, whose pastor booted them out of the church to make their ministry and outreach project. When they start knitting in a mall, they encounter many new people. In her second book, Mondragon centers her group in a retirement community. Most of the community is living a life of book clubs, golfing and splashing in the pool. But,

for the marriages torn apart with one of the partners living in the memory care unit, life is not so good. The Tangled Tale of the Woolgathering Castoffs will tug at your heartstrings as the women not only knit for enjoyment, but also to solve the problems of their neighbors in any way they can. They start each meeting with a prayer for their neighbors and warmly welcome anyone who stops by their group. The women have different personalities, but they all look to the Lord for answers. In my favorite review of this book, someone said they didn't know how much fun the adventures of the elderly knitting would be. Don't miss this sweet and inspirational read!

If octogenarians knitting isn't your kind of book, Janice Cantore's romantic suspense novel might be more your style. One Final Target is a fictional story about the danger our first responders face in real life. Sergeant Jodie King's team was out on a routine assignment of serving a warrant. When they knocked on the door, a bomb went off killing all her teammates and friends. The grief and the trauma caused Jodie to leave the police department. Weeks later she returned to the bombing site to try and find some peace, only to be shot at again. Luckily for her Sam Gresham, the newest detective for the county sheriff's department, was near the scene. Sam knew about grief too, having lost his partner and friend in a crash caused by a drunk driver. The two bond by understanding what the other is feeling, and they throw themselves into finding out who is trying again to kill Jodie – and wondering if she was the real target in the bombing. This book will keep you from your housework until you turn the last page. By the way, I want to mention that Lynette Eason's book *Double Take*, which I reviewed last month, has been a hit with a couple of the library patrons who have had a chance to read it. They said it was one of the better books they have read in a long time and can't wait for Eason's next installment in the Lake City Heroes series. Unfortunately, the second book *Target Acquired* won't be out till August. Good thing we have plenty of other options on the shelves.

In the financial report for the first month of 2024, contributions are slightly behind the budget, while expenses are above our budget. We expect giving to catch up to the budget as we move through the year. Expenses in the month are higher because we made our full year budgeted payment of \$10,000 against our loans. Our remaining borrowing on the parsonage has been reduced to \$40,751, and the bell tower loan is down to \$58,869, thanks to the continued support from our congregation.

We're grateful to all our congregation and guests who continue to support the work of First Church, as we serve the Lord by opening doors for all to know salvation through Jesus. We continue to ask for your prayers, presence and support through service and gifts to First Church's mission. We look forward to having you join us this Lenten season as we serve the King together.
