From the Pastor's Desk..

Cross in the Marketplace

By the time you read this, Holy Week and Easter will have passed. We will have celebrated Jesus' triumphal entry on Palm Sunday and walked through His final week at the Passion Play Experience. We will have celebrated Easter, beginning at sunrise in the Mechanicsburg Cemetery, and followed by two joy-filled celebrations of Christ's resurrection in our beautiful sanctuary. And, once again, we will have joined with congregations from the Mechanicsburg area in a Good Friday Prayer Walk. The Prayer Walk began in 2016, when several small groups from our church walked throughout Mechanicsburg and stopped to pray at our schools, our fire companies, our police station, businesses and churches. The following year, other churches from Mecha-

nicsburg and Upper Allen met at six different locations throughout the community. We then gathered together for for worship, prayer, and fellowship at First Church of God on Main Street. The Prayer Walk has continued every Good Friday since, except for a pause during the pandemic.

Each year, I'm blessed to be part of this powerful, unified witness for Christ in our community. The Prayer Walk is one of many ways God is moving to unite us, across denominational lines, for the sake of reaching our Mechanicsburg area with the Good News!

As I was preparing for this year's Holy Week Services, our Prayer Walk, and Easter, I came across these words by George MacLeod. Rev. MacLeod was one of the Church of Scotland's most influential pastors in the 20th century and founder of the Iona Community. MacLeod's words are just as relevant for us in 2024 as they were when he wrote them:

"I simply argue that the cross be raised again at the center of the marketplace as well as on the steeple of the church. I am recovering the claim that Jesus was not crucified in a cathedral between two candles, but on a cross between two thieves; on the town garbage heap; at a crossroad so cosmopolitan that they had to write his title in Hebrew and in Latin and in Greek; at the kind of place where cynics talk smut, and thieves curse, and soldiers gamble. Because that is where he died. And that is what he died about. And that is where Christians ought to be, and what Christians ought to be about."

Picturing the cross in the marketplace, and not just on the altar at church, is a powerful reminder for us. God gave his only Son because "God so loved the world" (John 3:16). As we continue to celebrate the Good News of Easter, I invite you to consider where your marketplace is. What does it look like for you to represent Jesus, our crucified and risen Lord, there?

Easter people, may we so love the world that Jesus loves!

During our worship services on Sunday, March 24, we celebrated the ministry of Tina Eaton, who retired from the First Church staff on March 31.

Tina joined our church staff in 2007 as Director of Congregational Care. A few years later, became our Director of Discipleship. Tina's love for Christ and for First Church has been evident in every aspect of her ministry.

She has coordinated year-round discipleship opportunities and led and resourced Sunday School classes, small groups, new member classes, and groups for women and men. Tina has been the staff liaison for the welcoming ministry and fellowship teams and has served on the planning team for our annual women's retreats. With her bright, friendly presence, Tina has helped to create a culture of hospitality. Working with many faithful volunteers, she has played a key role in helping First Church to become a warm, welcoming congregation.

In 2018, with Tina's leadership, we did a year-long, church-wide discipleship program called, "Be One, Make One." We distributed some 700 Bibles and invited the whole congregation to a daily Bible reading around a common theme. Tina was also actively involved with pastors, staff, and leaders as we navigated the many difficult decisions we had to make during the pandemic. We were able not just to survive, but to thrive as a congregation because of the great care of Tina and others through that challenging time. Tina's exceptional gifts for organization and planning have blessed our entire church family, including our pastors and staff. On countless occasions, Tina has seen details others may have missed, asked the right questions at just the right time, and served quietly behind the scenes to ensure excellence in our life and ministry.

We give thanks to God for Tina's 17 years of faithful service as a member of the First Church staff. We're grateful for her abiding commitment, to be a disciple of Jesus and to make disciples of Jesus! Later this spring, Tina and her husband Barry will retire to their new home and be closer to their family, in Lewes, Delaware.

With Tina's retirement, the Staff-Parish Relations Committee is prayerfully considering the next steps to fill the Director of Discipleship position. Meanwhile, the SPRC is working with Pastor Denny and our church staff to ensure that the vital ministries Tina cared for continue. We will keep the congregation informed.

I'm sure caring for all those animals at least kept her mind somewhat occupied. Since I don't have pets, I'll light some candles, turn on the music, and write about some books I'd like to read and hope you will too. That always turns my mood around.

When you see this book in the library with its cover photo of a windswept beach, it'll lift your mood and make you think of hot summer days and loads of sunshine. The plot of Denise Hunter's Love Unscripted revolves around Chloe Anderson, who has written the perfect beach read. When the book is purchased







for a movie, Chloe is aghast that Hollywood bad boy Liam Hamilton is cast for the lead. Chloe protests, but to no avail. Liam needs his public reputation adjusted, and his agent concocts the perfect PR plan: Liam and Chloe will pretend to be a couple. Liam can get some good PR and Chloe can further her writing career with a social media boost. What could go wrong? I'll let you find out. I rarely read romances, but I like Denise Hunter's writing style, as she makes her characters seem genuine and usually adds some comedy to keep it light. See what you think.

EMT Boo Kingston resents having to train a celebrity instead of concentrating on her job. But being the rookie, she has no say in her job assignments. When five women go missing from a resort during a potential blizzard, the Air One rescue squad and even the superstar must pull together to find the women before tragedy strikes. I won't give away any more of the plot, but I will tell that the book just came out this week and already has a five-star review. You won't want to miss this romantic and suspenseful page-turner.

The financial report for February shows contributions well ahead of expectations, more than making up for last month's shortfall. Expenses for the month were in line with expectations. Year-to-date income is ahead of plan by roughly \$1,500. Expenses are slightly higher than plan because we made our full-year budgeted payment of \$10,000 against our loans. Our remaining borrowing on the parsonage has been reduced to \$40,751 and the bell tower loan is down to \$58,469, thanks to continued support from our congregation.

We're grateful to all our congregation and guests who continue to support the work of First Church, as we serve the Lord by opening doors for all to know salvation through Jesus. We continue to ask for your prayers, presence and support through service and gifts to First Church's mission. We look forward to having you join us this Lenten season as we serve the King together.

Change for Water

Water is the foundation of our very lives. Yet, according to the United Nations, over 2 billion people lack access to clean, readily available drinking water. First Church Mission Moments...

Camp and Retreat Ministry

"What do you remember most about camp?"

Ask anyone who has been to one of our camps, and you'll get a wide range of answers: my friends, the counselors, playing games, the food, music or crafts. This is because when we attend camp, we're met where we are.

For me, the music of children singing, laughing and raising their voices in praise echoes in my thoughts. I can hear their voices singing "Allelujah! Praise ye the Lord!" back and forth, getting louder and louder. I hear the sweetness of their descant as they proclaim that they want to become "sanctuaries, pure and holy, tried and true." I've loved seeing kids who were timid the first day or two, unsure of the words or motions, become bold and sure of themselves by week's end. As they become more at ease at camp, their songs are multiplied. Parents who drive home with carloads of kids who spend the whole ride telling stories, laughing at jokes and teaching camp songs to their parents. I've seen it happen so often, but it still holds wonder for me. It's truly miraculous.

And, here is the real beauty of camp ministry: the music and its miracles may touch my heart, but each person who comes will leave with their own story of a wonder that they encountered. Maybe they met someone who was kind in a way they hadn't known, or they learned to play a game that brought them so much joy. Jesus meets everyone at camp. At each program, the Holy Spirit moves in the campers and volunteers as a group, but also as individuals. Everyone comes to camp as a person known by Jesus, and He ensures that in our time with Him, we will be drawn closer to Him.
