Opening Doors with Christ, One Another and Our Neighbors

From the Pastor's Desk....

"Let God's Word Soak In"

For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I propose. Isaiah 55:10-11

It's been a rainy spring so far! We had rain almost every day in April. And not the brief, storms that suddenly drench the hard soil, and quickly evaporate. This rain has been persistent, saturating the ground. I would've enjoyed a few more days of sunshine, but all this rain has given us lush green grass and blossoming trees and flowers.

Isaiah 55 gives us a beautiful picture of God's faithfulness. Just as the earth is saturated with rain and snow, making it sprout and providing seed and bread, God's Word will go forth and accomplish all that God proposes. The prophet envisions soaking in the Word of God. When God's instruction floods our souls, we grow in His grace and wisdom.

While God's Word is revealed to us in many ways, one of the most important is the Bible. Isaiah's vision guides us toward receiving and responding to God's Word. First, his image of every word that comes from God's mouth falling like rain and snow reminds us that it takes time for the earth to become saturated. It doesn't happen all at once. In the same way, **it takes time for our lives to be shaped by God's Word**.

We need to set apart time and space in our lives to receive God's Word. We receive God's Word in worship and in small group study. We also receive it through a daily time reading the Bible and in prayer. We encourage you to take advantage of all the resources First Church provides to help you let God's Word soak in. The Upper Room devotional is available online or on tables at the entrances to our sanctuary. In each month's newsletter, and in our weekly bulletins, we provide daily readings that coincide with our worship themes. Numerous translations of the Bible are available online and in print, and you can always pick up a copy right inside the main entrance doors.

Secondly, Isaiah suggests that **how much Scripture you read** isn't as important as **how you read it**. As we catch up on the daily news or enjoy a book, we tend to read quickly. The goal of reading the Bible, however, is to encounter God. We read slowly (maybe even out loud) so that the words can penetrate our hearts. Some will find a key verse and repeat it throughout the day, or write it down and post it somewhere as a reminder.

Thirdly, Isaiah's words are filled with the promise that **growth is inevitable** when we receive and respond to God's Word. By becoming saturated in Scripture, we become more like Jesus. As our hearts and minds are transformed, we learn to love others as Christ has loved us.

Isaiah invites us to be *Word-saturated people*. In your day-to-day life, and in your fellowship with one another, let God's Word soak in. The Promise Maker is the Promise Keeper. His Word in you, in us, will produce far beyond what we can ask or imagine!

#### From the Library

I have great news. First of all, the world didn't end during yesterday's solar eclipse (yes, that's usually predicted during unusual weather phenomena). And, today was not dreary. I think we've officially made it to spring! If all that good news hasn't already overwhelmed you, I'll also say we have some great new reads in the library. Let me get right to the books you'll want to read.

Melody Carlson is known for her short and sweet Christmas books, but she offers a sweet romance for the summer months. *Just for Summer* doesn't start as a romance, yet it seems to be headed that way. Two women, both in the hospitality industry and miles apart, discover that their jobs aren't right for them. Ginny Masters manages a boutique ho-



tel in Seattle. While she's great at her job, the fast pace and her demanding boss keep her from having much of a life outside work. Meanwhile in Idaho, Jacqueline Potter manages her grandfather's fishing lodge because it's the only job she could find after college. She finds this backwoods hotel work stifling, if not downright boring. Ginny and Jacqueline decide to solve their problems by trading jobs for the summer. But, will a change of scenery really change their lives? Will both women be willing to trade back at the end of summer, or will they give up and run back to their old lives after two weeks? I'll let you sit on your porch swing, sip iced tea, and savor this sweet summer read.

If you're like me and prefer a little more excitement in your reading material, check out *Fatal Witness* by Patricia Bradley. This is the second book in her Pearl River Series. If you've caught your breath since reading her first book, *Counter Attack*, you know Bradley's suspenseful writing and realistic characters make it hard to stop reading, even long after bedtime. Dani Bennett has been living in Montana for 25 years under a new name. Her memory of the first nine years of her life was blocked out after Dani witnessed the murder of her parents. When her uncle whisked away from the rest of her family to protect her, Dani began pouring herself into her work as a potter. Unknown to her, Dani's grandmother, Mae, has never stopped looking for her granddaughter. When Mae stumbles across a picture in a pottery magazine, she knows it's her long-lost granddaughter. She asks K-9 officer Mark Lassiter of Pearl Springs, Tennessee to find Dani. But, someone else doesn't want Dani found and will go to great lengths to keep the past hidden. I think the bonus material in this book is the dogs each main character owns. They add to the story as only animals can.

Actual expenses – YTD \$232,244 (25% of budget) Income for the four-week month of March was \$73,964, about \$2,000 ahead of our average four-week budget. As anticipated, expenses were a bit higher due to winter weather impacting costs of snow removal and heating fuel. For the year, expenses are right on target and in line with the contributions for the year. The church debt for the parsonage is now at \$40,751 and our bell tower loan is down to \$58,254.

We're grateful to all our congregation and guests who continue to support the work of First Church, as we serve the Lord by opening doors for all to know salvation through Jesus. We continue to ask for your prayers, presence and support through service and gifts to First Church's mission.

#### **Timeless Connections**

Many factors impact mental health in the United States today, including political issues, social issues, racism, ageism, pressure to succeed, economic struggles, work and family life balance, tolerance or intolerance of differing views and lifestyles — just to name a few. When these become overwhelming and impact one's daily life, it is always a sign of strength, and not weakness, to seek help.

Timeless Connections is a life coaching practice with a focus on faith and hope. The practice is based out of First Church and operated by Patti Vogl, a Licensed Master Social Worker and Certified Grief Specialist with over 30 years of experience in individual and family counseling. Life coaching involves helping people to identify barriers, goals, and strengths, then working toward an action-oriented plan to live to their fullest potential. Timeless Connections offers hope to those struggling with grief and loss (death, divorce, loss of job, loss of home, etc.), relationship issues, anxiety, depression, and elder care issues, decision-making, and motivational strategies.

There are multiple ways to support Timeless Connections' ministry, including First Church's mental health fund to provide free or reduced-cost mental wellness services to those who are in need. This service

is available to church members, as well as others in need in our community. Timeless Connections will assess referrals for utilizing this fund and will provide help if the need falls into the scope of services provided by Timeless Connections. If Timeless Connections cannot provide services, resources and referrals will be provided.
