From the Pastor's Desk...

"Hello-Goodbye-Hello"

"I thank my God for every remembrance of you, always in every one of my prayers for all of you, praying with joy for your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Jesus Christ."

Philippians 1:3-6

On the other side of every "Goodbye," there is always another "Hello" – a new day, bright with possibilities! As you embrace the future together, First Church, you will forever be in our hearts and in our prayers.

Recently, I was putting my daughter to bed one night and went to shut the window in her room. It was one of those spring nights when the temperature was going to dip into the 40s. As I was about to close the window, she said, "Don't shut it, Mom! I love to hear the birds singing and the sounds of spring when I wake up."

Spring is a time of change. Flowers blooming, birds singing, mowers going and tree pollen everywhere all remind me of God's presence with us through seasons of change.

Summer Sunday School | Sundays, 9:45-10:45 a.m.





Income for the four-week month of April was \$67,048, about \$4,200 short of our average four-week budget. Expenses for the month were \$91,396. This is the result of paying several full-year mission commitments totaling \$12,000, along with bills related to the colder weather. Year-to-date expenses are higher than contributions due to the timing of the loan payments, mission commitments and winter impacts. These will balance out as we move through the year. The church debt for the parsonage is now at \$40,751 and our bell tower loan is down to \$56,884.

As we move into the summer months, we pray for your safe travels. We're grateful to all our congregation and guests who continue to support the work of First Church, as we serve the Lord by opening doors for all to know salvation through Jesus. We continue to ask for your prayers, presence and support through service and gifts to First Church's mission.

First Church Mission Moments...

July: Gleaning

We're grateful and excited to once again partner with Oak Grove Farms to glean crops!

So, what exactly is gleaning? Gleaning is the practice of picking up crops that have been left behind in the fields after the harvest. In Leviticus and Deuteronomy, God commands the Israelites to not harvest all of their crops, but to leave some for the poor to glean. This showed God's compassion for the poor and needy by ensuring they have access to nourishment. We also see gleaning depicted in the story of Ruth, and some farms still practice gleaning today.

On the first Wednesday of each month of the growing season (June-October), First Church's Glean Team will meet in the parking lot at Oak Grove Farms (846 Fisher Rd., Mechanicsburg). Then, we'll head into the fields to collect leftover produce to share with our neighbors in need.

Last year, we followed Oak Grover's Farmer Dwayne into the fields to harvest broccoli, corn, tomatoes and cucumbers. The food we collect supplies the Salem Shares Food Pantry at Fishing Creek Salem United Methodist Church with fresh produce. We also distribute a portion of the fresh produce to each of the Little Free Pantries in downtown Mechanicsburg.

When gleaning, we encourage you to dress for the weather (including shoes that can get muddy). Gleaning typically takes 45-60 minutes, though some gleaners will arrive a little early to enjoy a treat from Oak Grove's ice cream counter! This is a wonderful service opportunity for people of all ages and abilities.
