



Dear First Church,

Fall at First Church kicked off with the Picnic on Sept 8th. Almost 80 people attended, enjoying food, games, and worship together on the green space. The weather was perfect and it was great to see many of our families gathering together. I shared a bit about what I'm really excited about this fall at First Church.

As we head towards fall, I am excited about...

- 1) Growing Together is a new all ages Sunday School offering on the 3rd Sunday of each month led by Katie Knorr and Lisa Aronson. This intergenerational time will include a lesson, activity and discussion together. On Sept 15th we had 15 people come and hope this becomes a time all ages can grow in faith together. Next one is Oct 20th in the Youth Lounge.
- 2) Worship has been a highlight this summer. Worship attendance has not seen a summer slump as we have averaged 228 people in-person worship, with 280 the week we did Blessing of the Backpacks! Online we average 158 people weekly watching the Traditional Service. Online worship is now the front door for churches, with many people worshiping online several weeks before coming in person (unless they are invited by a friend). I am excited we will start to stream live our 11 am service starting on Dec1st. We look forward to sharing this worship as well and ways this will allow those traveling and guests to worship online in the contemporary style as well. I also love the Kids Message at 11 am, with regularly 5-8 kids coming up for a short message and Hershey Kiss.
- 3) This fall Oct 13-Nov 7 we will participate in a sermon series called Do Unto Others focusing on the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 7:12. The sermon series will combine with a Kindness Campaign as we think intentionally about ways to bridge the divides in our community and talking about ways to vote for kindness overcoming polarization in our country through civility and respect. Watch the church bulletin for ways to engage in kindness events throughout this series.

As we move into fall I hope you will join us in the *Do Unto Others* series. Think about who you might invite to worship with us one of those weeks and ways you can spread kindness throughout our community.

It's good -bye summer and here comes fall, though we Pennsylvanians know that maybe we will see a hint of summer again. But this is a perfect time to get your pumpkin spice latte ready, a cozy shawl, and, of course, a great book. As luck would have it, I have a few books to tell you about.

Denise Hunter has been a favorite in the library for twenty years, and she never disappoints. Her mixture of romance and down-to-earth scenarios make



her books irresistible. Her latest stand alone novel, *Before We Were Us*, builds on the premise of memory loss. When Lauren Wentworth wakes up in the hospital after falling from a ladder, she has no memory of the last four months. What is she doing at a rustic resort instead of her big city dream job is her number one question. But even more mind boggling to her is that her number one nemesis, Jonah Landry is now her boyfriend. She decided to permanently forget the last four months and get on with her real life. But can Jonah just let go of her so easily? Get an extra shot of espresso in your latte; you will be up late finding that answer.

Another favorite in the library is Irene Hannon. Ms. Hannon writes both romance books and mysteries. Her latest book is the second in her series *Undaunted Courage*. Lindsey Barnes is the main character in *Over the Edge*. Though just recovering from a deadly trauma, she is also the sole witness in a high-profile murder case. But the murderer is set on not only pushing her to the edge, but also making her look like an unreliable witness. Sometimes only her certainty about what she saw is the only thing that keeps her going. Fortunately, she has found an ally in police detective Jack Tucker. At first, he wasn't sure about her, but after getting to know her better, Jack is sure that someone is targeting both her sanity and her life. You won't want to quit this page turner either until you find out just how this mystery can be solved without more bloodshed.

Financial Report

August revenue of \$64,979 is about \$7,000 unfavorable to the average 4-week income we have budgeted. However, this year was better than last August when we had revenue of \$57,286, as the summer months are generally low. Year to date giving is about \$16,000 lower than last year's giving through the month of August. We expect to see a pickup in giving as our fall season brings more people back to regular attendance, supplemented with larger gatherings for the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons.

Expenses for the month were \$66,777, about \$5000 less than our average monthly budget. YTD expenses are higher than income by nearly \$16,000, mostly due to utilities (\$9,000) and the early timing of the loan payments (\$3,000). Compared to last year, YTD expenses are almost identical 2024 vs 2023. The church debt for the parsonage is now down to \$40,637 and our Bell Tower loan was lowered to \$45,039.

As we head into the back-to- school and back to church time, we welcome you to continue or join us in our mission to open doors for all to know Salvation through Jesus. We are grateful to all our congregation and guests who continue to support the work of First Church with your prayers, your presence and your support through service and gifts to the mission of our First Church family.


