Maybe you have noticed in this time of uncertainty, that our dear pastor is preaching on calmness and kindness. So I am taking my cue from her –at least on the first selection for this newsletter. But I will start slowly and build to more heart pounding offerings.

Many of you have enjoyed book series offered by Guidepost, and a donor has given the library a new series containing twenty-four books. If you like this collection, you are set for the whole month of November and maybe into the whirlwind month of Decem-



ber. The set is *Miracles of Marble Cove* and I love the description of "escape to Marble Cove, a quaint seaside town". Doesn't that sound calming? The description mentions that the books are about four women who are bonded by shared secrets. A little mystery frequently keeps the books from becoming too saccharin, plus a well-known writer once said there is really no story worth reading without a little drama. Another thing you might enjoy about these books is that they have some seasonal themes, like Christmas or autumn. The public saw the glamorous woman; he saw a woman with traumatic memories that she tried to quell with pills. Even after the job ended, Mac kept an eye on Joe Sue and when her life fell apart, he was there to try and put the pieces back together. The only problem Joe Sue wasn't sure she had any reason to keep going. I won't spoil the ending. but keep the tissues handy. And plan to stay up late, because you won't want to put down this great read.



FINANCIAL REPORT

Giving for the five Sundays of September totaled \$87,462, which is about \$1,000 unfavorable to the

average 5-week income we have budgeted. However, this year was much better than last September when we had revenue of \$73,884, making up for some of the shortfall versus last year in the summer months. Year to date giving is almost even to last year's giving through the month of September. With our church family back from vacations and the approaching holidays, we expect giving to continue higher than the summer months.

Expenses for the month were \$62,347, significantly favorable (less) than our average 5-week budget. YTD expenses are less than expected by \$23,000 and we now have a surplus of more than \$9,000. Compared to last year, YTD expenses are favorable (lower) than 2023 by \$6000. The church debt for the parsonage is now down to \$40,637 and our bell tower loan was lowered to \$44,319.

As we head into the Holiday Season, we welcome you to continue or join us in our mission to open doors for all to know Salvation through Jesus. We are grateful to all our congregation and guests who continue to support the work of First Church with your prayers, your presence and your support through service and gifts to the mission of our First Church family.


