












The Saturday after Thanksgiving we have a tradition at our house of staying in pjs to clean and decorate the house for Christmas. December as a pastor, and with a child, is often a whirlwind of extra events and obligations at church and school. So before chaos begins I always make sure decorations are up, lights outside hung, and firm Christmas wish lists are created (shopping comes later...).

Each year we put up our Nativity Scene, unpacking carefully the wisemen, shepherds, Mary, Joseph and baby Jesus. Some years the wise men are in the scene, other years they are hidden around the house to be found, knowing it took a few years for the wise men to meet baby Jesus as they weren't part of that first Christmas night.

As I unpack them, I am reminded that like me, Mary and Joseph were real people, living real lives, struggling with real challenges and yet each open to being used by God this story of Jesus that we have retold and celebrated for over 2000 years. The birth of their child impacted lives far beyond his parents. What about Elizabeth and Zechariah that were in their inner circle, what were they thinking? How did the shepherds and magi encounter the Christ child? And Herod, oh what was he thinking? Or the Innkeeper, was there regret for not offering a room for the birth of our Savior?

This Advent we will explore some of the Unlikely Characters of Advent as we see how their lives, and ours, are interwoven with God's purpose and plan. We will sing favorite hymns of the season each Sunday in Advent. The Dec 29th worship service will be a service of song, scripture and letters to God.

I truly pray this is an Advent you will draw closer to Christ and be moved closer to Christ as we celebrate his birth together.

#### **From the Library**

I am pretty sure I say this all the time, but I can't believe Christmas is less than a month away as I write this article. Of course, if you have been in any major stores, you would have thought Christmas had moved to October or at least November. Working in the library always makes me think in the "two week ahead" mentality due to stamping due dates on books. But at least today it is not 80 degrees, I am wearing a sweater, and I am listening to Christmas music. So far, I am not panicking over all the tasks required (mostly by me) for the holidays. So, let's talk about one of my most favorite topics: books. As always, I have some great holiday reads.



A Lancaster Amish Christmas is a collection of four short novellas that feature Christmas and romance. Written by some of the library's favorite authors, I don't think this will disappoint you. The readers on Amazon gave the book a five-star review and mentioned how engaging each story was. And if that is not enough to entice you into reading this book, I will mention that 4 short stories are easier to fit into a busy schedule than a full length novel. Set in Lancaster, you may identify with some of the settings. Grab some hot chocolate and get ready to have your spirit lifted by this holiday read.

Every year the library purchases Melody Carlson's holiday book and this year is no exception. At only 176 pages, *The Christmas Tree Farm* is another great book for the season. Main character Madison Mc-Dowell returns from teaching overseas for several years thinking she will take her place on her family's Christmas tree farm in Oregon. Little does she know in her absence her sister has neglected the property, and recent wildfires have added to the problem. In fact, her sister is planning to sell the farm. If all that is not enough, her neighbor plans to turn his property into a noisy dirt bike track. But Madison will not let the farm go without a fight, and she starts working toward her dream of having a Christmas tree farm as her life's work. Did I mention her neighbor is a former flame and now a widower? Really, I don't think I need to say more.

And now I am getting to my favorite, *Christmas in the Crosshairs* by Lynette Eason, Kate Angelo, and Kelly Underwood. This book contains three novellas, also designed for the holidays. Yes, it is hard to think of murder and mayhem in a Christmas setting unless you watch Die Hard every year as part of your Christmas traditions. But the authors have added some romantic suspense to each story and maybe even some happy endings to keep them from getting too heavy. This book is an add-on to The Elite Guardian Collection and each story features the main characters from each of the three books. Though you don't need to read the earlier books to enjoy this one, the other books provide background for each story. We have them in our library ready for you to check out.

But if none of these books is for you, stop in and let our volunteers find just the right book for you.

#### **FINANCIAL REPORT**

Income for the four Sundays of October totaled \$80,914, which is roughly 10,000 better than an average month and includes some one-time gifts. Income lags slightly where we expect to be at this point in the year. As we approach the holidays we believe income will continue as anticipated. We thank all individuals and families for living out being generous givers to First Church in ways both through gifts and service. Thank you also to our staff and volunteers for their stewardship of these gifts. Expenses for the month were \$66,955, keeping First Church under budget. Year-to-date (YTD) expenses are less than expected by about \$30,000, with a surplus of \$24,700. Utilities is one area that remain above the budgeted range. The church debt for the parsonage is \$40,637 and our bell tower loan was lowered to \$43,709.

Thank you all for participating in Consecration Sunday a few weeks ago and for your commitments to the supporting the mission of First Church in 2025. Our Finance Committee uses the information you provide for anticipated giving to develop a 2025 budget, along with input from other committees and church staff. Our budget provides a sensible roadmap for the daily operation of our church as well as the missions we support locally and globally that help us serve our neighbor and share God's love.

#### **Change for Water**

Water is the foundation of our very lives. Yet, according to the United Nations, over 2 billion people lack access to clean, readily available drinking water.
