On Easter Sunday we heard how Cleopas and Simon walked from Jerusalem to Emmaus because they didn't understand and believe that Jesus was alive. Even as Jesus walked beside them, they were not able to see and know it was him.

Do you sometimes struggle to see, hear, or know where God is in your life? I know I have (and still do at times). And when we don't hear God's voice then we have trouble knowing what direction to go in our lives.

During May we are going to be using the book Whisper by Mark Batterson to explore how to hear God's voice. Whisper is defined as "speaking very softly using one's breath without one's vocal cords." There are many reasons whisper, sometimes so we don't spoil a surprise, or we don't want someone to hear, or we want someone to pull in closer and listen attentively.

In 1 Kings, Elijah was a prophet, but struggling to hear God's voice and direction when an angel tells him to go to Mt Horeb.

The Lord said, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by." Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains apart and shattered the rocks before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire came a gentle whisper. - 1 Kings 19:11-12 NIV

Elijah had to go to the mountain because life was so busy and loud he could not hear God's voice. Sometimes we can get away to focus on God's voice such as the men's or women's retreat. And yet we also need to learn how, within the busy and loud lives that we live, how can we learn to lean in and hear the whisper of God's voice each and every day?

In worship we are going to look at God's Whisper in Scripture on May 4, Whispers of Desires and Doors on May 11, Whispers of Dreams and People on May 18, and Whispers of Promptings and Pain on May 25. If you want to dig more, you can order a book to read along or join one of our small groups that you can find more information about later in the newsletter.

I pray in this series we would all be able to pray the words of 1 Samuel 3:9 Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening. AND that if Jesus were walking beside us like he did for Cleopas and Simon on that road to Emmaus we would know his voice immediately, not 2 hours and 7 miles later. I hope during Whisper you will hear, experience and lean into God's voice throughout this sermon series.

#### From the Library

I am writing this on a very chilly day in April, looking out the window at the beautiful flowers and wondering if they will still be beautiful tomorrow. I hope by the time you read this newsletter in May, Spring will be here to stay. If not, it would be a good time to curl up with a book and ignore the weather. Of course, I have a few suggestions.

Author Janice Cantore is a former police officer which gives her the inside knowledge of how the police department works. This knowledge makes her books so real and her characters so believable. In her latest



book, Every Deadly Suspicion, the main character Chief of Police Hanna Keyes not only has crime to deal with in Dry Oaks, but also her father. Her father has been in prison for 35 years for murders he committed while he was chief of police. Hanna has never had anything to do with him, but now he is dying, and he is being given compassionate release if Hanna will take him. Her first thought is no, but then the bodies of some of the murder victims have never been found. Maybe she can convince her father to reveal

the locations. No sooner does he arrive at Hanna's home than one crisis after another begins to occur. First a wildfire that brings Hanna's first love Jared back to town, and then a series of murders that her current boyfriend, Nathan is trying to solve. If that is not enough, a true crime podcaster is trying to also get her father's confession about the murders for his podcast. All of this while living with and caring for a man Hanna doesn't even like. You won't want to miss this page turner—I think you will be surprised at the ending.

If mayhem and murder aren't your genre, dive into Irene Hannon's series of *Hope Harbor* novels. Her latest is Sunrise Reef and just the picture on the front of the book will calm your soul. Main character Bren Ryan has found her place working as a barista in Hope Harbor. She rents a guest cottage from Fred Ward, an elderly man in the community. Life is good for Bren, but she feels she needs to make some changes and get more involved in the community. She begins to help Emma Blair a downtrodden young woman. Enter Noah Ward, Fred's son. Noah has decided his father needs to move closer to him so Fred can get any help he needs from his son. Noah did not know Fred had rented out his cottage to a woman Noah defines as quirky. But as Noah and Bren get to know each other, a friendship forms and who knows what will blossom next. This is a gentle romance with a subplot of helping others. You won't want to miss it.

If neither of these books is for you, stop in and let our volunteer help you find just the right book for you.

#### **Financial Report**

Through March 31, 2025

#### General Fund

2025 Budget \$869,000

Expected Income \$217,250 (25% of year complete)

Actual Income \$220,175 (25% of budget)
Actual Expenses \$205,585 (24% of budget)

The financial report for March shows income slightly ahead of expectations so far in 2025, thanks to improved giving numbers (and a 5-Sunday month in March) and interest income from bank accounts. Expenses remain lower than anticipated for this year.

The church debt for the parsonage remains at \$38,637, and the belltower loan stands at \$36,713, following a principal and interest payment on the belltower loan this past month.

We thank you for your continued generosity and prayers in support of First Church through this Easter season!

# Stained Glass Class



I have always wondered about the meaning of the stain glass windows at First Church. So, with a little help from the Church library, I thought we would explore the windows and their symbolism. The first window that we are going to look at is the window with the wheat stalk.

There are two wheat windows in the church. One is located on the left side of the stain glass window depicting Jesus and the little children in the Sanctuary and the second one is on the 2nd floor of the 4th window from the Frederick St. entrance to the building

Wheat was an important dietary staple for the people in the Old and New Testaments and even today. How many of us have a slice of toast or a bagel made out of wheat for breakfast in the morning. Wheat was an image of plenty and blessings of God among his people. Exodus 34:22 describes the Festival of Weeks in which the first fruits of wheat harvest were given to God. In Deuteronomy 8:8, Moses describes the promised land as a land of wheat, barley, vines and fig trees. When Solomon was building the temple, he purchased the cedars of Lebanon in part by trading with wheat for them (I Kings 5:11). In the New Testament, John the Baptist describes the coming of Jesus with these words: 11 "I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. 12 His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." (Matthew 3: 11-12) (NRSV)

In Matthew 13: 24-30, Jesus tells the parable of the wheat and weeds. In the parable, good wheat seed

is planted in a field but weeds are planted by an enemy in that field, too. When the wheat comes up so does the weeds. When the servants ask the master what to do about this, he tells the servants to let both grow together. When harvesting, the weeds will be burnt and wheat gathered in the barns. The wheat is like the good people of the Kingdom of God while the weeds are the evil ones and will be burnt as part of the final judgment.

We can't end this discussion about wheat without talking about bread. Wheat is turned into bread using the water sent by God. Bread is staple of the diet in biblical times and is today too. Bread is one of the things sacrificed to the Lord (Exodus 29:2, Leviticus 2:4-16). In both the tabernacle and the temple, 12 loaves of showbread were in the Holy of Holies. Unleavened bread is part of the Passover ritual in the Old Testament. Exodus also tells us that manna is bread that God has given the people who wandered in the wilderness to eat.

In the New Testament bread is a powerful symbol. Jesus reminds the devil that man does not live by bread alone but by every word that comes from God (Matthew 4: 4). In the Lord's prayer, Jesus says "Give us this day our daily bread." Jesus takes bread and feeds 5,000 more than 5,000 people with it. Jesus said in John 6:35, "I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry." (NIV). Finally, at the last supper, Jesus takes bread blesses it and breaks it saying: Take, this is my body" (Mark 14: 22). Let's remember God's love for us when we see wheat grown in the fields and bread on our table.
